### Begründungen

#### 0

The speaker says: "[...] the right to operate a cab in New York. The value of a New York taxi medallion has risen nearly 2,000%." Therefore, a New York City cab medallion has increased in price by 2,000%

#### 1

The speaker says: "The medallion system was introduced in <u>1937</u>." Medallions were therefore first used in <u>1937</u>.

#### 2

The speaker says: "The medallion is placed on the right front of the hood of the car." Therefore, the correct position on the car for the medallion is the front right hood.

#### 3

The speaker says: "Right, approximately 13,000 medallions in the City of New York right now." Therefore, at present the number of New York City cabs is approximately 13,000.

#### 4

The speaker says: "Then gradually there were increases [...] then in the 1990s again to, to add as benefits for veterans and also to get more <u>handicapped-accessible cabs</u> [...]." In the late 20<sup>th</sup> century, extra medallions were therefore issued to increase the number of handicapped accessible cabs.

#### 5

The speaker says: "The price has been going up <u>about \$50,000</u> every six months." Therefore, at present the cost of a medallion is rising twice a year by about \$50,000.

#### 6

The speaker says: "That's part of the reason why they are so expensive. Because there is a limited number, the turnover is small and because the pay-out, the guarantee on that, people have pointed this out before, is better than gold or the stock market." A medallion is therefore a more valuable investment than gold or the stock market.

## 7

The speaker says: "If you own one, then you now have the right - and this is the case since <u>1979</u> – this is another important date in taxi history, if you will – owner-drivers could lease out their cars for the other twelve hours of the day or even for the twenty-four hours if they want to go to Florida to live." Medallion owners have therefore been permitted to rent out their cars since 1979.

#### 8

The speaker says: "Under law, <u>42%</u> of the medallions are supposed to be allotted to owner-drivers." The number of medallions available for drivers with their own cabs is legally set at 42%.
