

Justifications

The speaker says: "<u>The National Transportation Safety Board has called for a nationwide ban on the use of all portable electronic devices by drivers, except in an emergency</u>." Recording 1 thus states that an organisation wants to forbid mobile devices in certain situations.

The speaker says: "[...] <u>a person using a cell phone while driving is four times more likely to crash and end up in the hospital. Distracted driving was the cause of more than 3,000 deaths in 2010.</u>" Recording 1 thus states that people using mobiles have more accidents and injuries.

The speaker says: "You'd navigate from one feature to another simply by tilting your head."

The speaker says: "The glasses [...] would not need to interface with a smart phone. They would actually be a smart phone that connects via Wi-Fi."

Recording 2 thus states that moving a body part steers the device and that this invention replaces another communication device.

The speaker says: "As much as mobile-phone technology improves over time, there's <u>one aspect</u> guaranteed to <u>remain the same – screen size</u>. Any bigger and you start creeping into tablet territory. <u>That's why laser based mini projectors have become popular</u>. Connect one to your phone and you can display a much larger version of your screen onto most surfaces."

The speaker says: "Now researchers [...] are looking to integrate mini projectors into the phone itself. [...] They can't make your home movies and vacation photos more interesting, but at least your audience will be wowed by how you display them."

Recording 3 thus states that this invention solves the problem of small displays and showing your photos will become easier.

The speaker says: "[...] background noise can really ruin a phone conversation. [...] It's <u>a voice processor</u> embedded in about 50 different mobile phone models <u>designed to enhance voice quality while</u> <u>suppressing background noise."</u>

The speaker says: "We said, <u>let's figure out how the brain separates sounds from other sounds in a fully general way,</u> and then we found that it could be used for noise reduction."

Recording 4 thus states that calling somebody in large crowds is made easier and that this device imitates what the human body is doing in such situations.

The speaker says: "Yet hydrogen fuel cells do work and they're greener than batteries. So how about using a mini hydrogen fuel cell to recharge something small – like your mobile phone battery?"
