Text B (North West: Abel and Cole) says: "Bananas are fairtrade." Abel and Cole therefore helps producers in other countries to get a good price for their fruit.

Text E (South East: The Ethical Food Company) says: "Delivered in a <u>wooden crate</u>, which protects food well and can be returned with the next order." The Ethical Food Company therefore has the strongest packaging.

Text A (London: Farmaround) says: "Minimum order of £12.25 and delivery at £1.00." Farmaround therefore does not deliver below a certain order value.

Text D (South West: Rod and Ben's) says: "Delivered in good condition in a <u>sealed</u> cardboard box with many items individually packaged." Rod and Ben's therefore tightly closes their packaging material.
